The Grand Forks Regional Airport Authority is a dynamic independent public authority, responsible for operating the Grand Forks region's primary commercial cargo and passenger airport, Grand Forks International Airport. As one of the area's primary tools for stimulating the economy and facilitating international trade, you can depend on us to help you get your import or export cargo quickly and efficiently to your markets—whether in the U.S. or around the globe—and to keep your costs competitive.

Using a foreign trade zone (FTZ) like GFK's FTZ #103 can save you time and money. That's because within the FTZ foreign goods are considered to be in international commerce and not subject to customs duties unless or until they enter the U.S. In addition, raw materials, parts and components can enter duty-free. Goods can then be assembled, manufactured or processed—and the final

product reexported—without paying customs duties.

A foreign trade zone lets you:

- bring in product incrementally, thereby preserving cash flow and gaining interest savings;
- repair, salvage or clean a product for distribution;
- store and repack merchandise for export or domestic distribution; and
- manufacture product from foreign and/or domestic parts.



GFK's general-purpose FTZ #103 consists of 48 acres conveniently located at two Grand Forks, North Dakota sites—on the Grand Forks International Airport and in the Grand Forks Industrial Park. Both sites are easily accessible by highways I-29 and US2. Because of its location on the Grand Forks International Airport and near the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad mainline, FTZ #103 is well-positioned to serve importers to the northern Great Plains region as well as exporters to markets worldwide.



A subzone is geographically removed from the general-purpose FTZ, designated for a specific use and user. Subzones are located at

the user's private facility and authorized when a firm's operations cannot be accommodated in the physical confines of the general-purpose zone. Subzones offer all the benefits of a general-purpose zone. There is one activated subzone site sponsored by FTZ #103: the Imation Corporation plant at Wahpeton, ND.
